

The Common-Sense Take on the 2020 Presidential Election



The Election of 2020: The Election of 2020 is five days old as of the date of publication of this latest update to my book. As of Election Day night, it appeared Donald Trump had his reelection sewn up. In the subsequent days, more and more ballots for Biden and the Democrats have been added to the tally. Given the reliance on mail-in and “drop-box” ballots (*and the associated **relaxing/ disregard of voter identity verification standards/ LAWS***), precipitated by COVID, this situation is not optimal but somewhat expected. Trump supporters look at the Mueller Investigation, **the Impeachment of Trump for Biden’s corruption**, and the non-stop vitriol from the Democrat’s political leaders and their media allies, and they come to the conclusion that the Democrats/ Left **will do ANYTHING to gain power**. tens of millions of Americans, **trust** in these public sector Democrats to conduct legitimate and fair elections **is simply not there**.
